Armor Up: Shoes of Peace

(Ephesians 6:15 & Various Texts)

Shoes

Paul does not actually use the term 'shoe'
OInstead, he calls on God's people to <u>bind</u> their <u>feet</u>
OThe Roman soldier frequently wore <u>caligae</u>, half-boots

The Gospel of Peace

- Our call is to be equipped with a <u>readiness</u> that comes with the Gospel of peace oGospel: <u>Good News</u>
 - The good news that Jesus comes to give us <u>peace</u>
 - oPeace: a restored <u>relationship</u> between (Eph. 2:14-18)
 - <u>Us</u> & <u>God</u>
 - One another
- This image is again from <u>Isaiah</u> (Isa. 52:7)

Readiness

- The call is not simply to believe the Gospel, but rather to be equipped with a <u>readiness</u> that comes from this Gospel
- First, to <u>know</u> the Gospel & <u>live</u> in the peace of our restored relationship with <u>God</u> (Rom. 5:1) • And work toward peace with <u>one another</u> (Rom. 12:18)
- Second, we are to be ready to <u>share</u> this Good News of peace with all (1 Pet. 3:15; Isa. 52:7; Col. 4:6)

Peace as Armor

- The peace that we have in Christ guards us against the Devil's schemes (Phil. 4:7)
- The message of 'peace' in the midst of <u>battle</u> seems illogical oHowever, Peace is supposed to be the <u>endgame</u> of all war
 - The Gospel message is that Jesus <u>defeats</u> evil to bring us <u>peace</u> (Rom. 16:20a)

So What?

- Do we know peace with God through Jesus? • Are we working toward peace with one another?
- Are we proclaiming that Good News to all?
