Teach Us to Pray: "Forgive Us"

Matthew 6:12, 14-15

Praying for Forgiveness (v. 12a)

Jesus teaches us to pray for forgiveness

Forgive (ἀφίημι): To <u>release</u> or <u>send</u> away something

Jesus states that we need our debts sent away

This is *not* a reference to monetary debt

But rather spiritual debt accrued via sin (Luke 11:4; Ps 103:12)

Offering Forgiveness (v. 12b)

Jesus states that our ability to receive God's forgiveness is dependent on our willingness to forgive <u>others</u>

The assumption is that we have already forgiven others

This is hard to do, which is why Jesus expands on this part of the prayer (Matt 6:14-15)

Our ability to receive forgiveness is directly tied to our willingness to offer it

Forgiveness is not a declaration of innocence

Rather, it is a declaration of guilt

And asking for forgiveness is a declaration of our sinfulness

When we understand the <u>magnitude</u> of our own indebtedness to God and His willingness to forgive us, it should move us to forgive others

This is about the condition of our hearts (Matt 18:21-35)

When we are unwilling to forgive others, we are keeping ourselves imprisoned (Col 3:13)

So What?

Are we seeking God for forgiveness? And our we offering it to others freely?

Meditation Verse: Matthew 6:12
