Ephesians: Living as New Creations Ephesians 4:17-24

The Old Life (v. 17-19)

- Paul's admonition is to walk/life differently than we used to
- The call to not walk like Gentiles is a reference to those who do not know <u>Christ</u> • Remember that he is speaking to both Jewish and Gentile converts
- This old life is defined by <u>futile minds</u> oFutile: devoid of <u>truth; perverse</u>
- Our actions are based in our <u>understanding</u> of the truth
- Thus, before Christ, we were: • Darkened in our <u>understanding</u> • <u>Ignorant</u> of God
- Resulting in <u>alienation</u> from real <u>life</u>
 <u>O Hard-hearted</u>
- Resulting in shameless, unfettered, sinful desires

The Renewal (v. 20-24)

- The change that God wants to bring in us starts on the inside
- It begins with learning <u>Christ</u>
 Not just learning <u>about</u> Jesus
 But learning how to be more <u>like</u> Jesus
- Change continues with a <u>desire</u> to get rid of the <u>old</u> oRealizing that the old ways of thinking are based in <u>lies</u> (v. 22)
- Then takes root as God renews our <u>minds</u> (v. 23) • Learning how to <u>think</u> all over again (Rom. 12:2)

The Progression

- Living differently begins with thinking in a new way
- Christ in us transforms our thinking
 - \rightarrow Which transforms our <u>desires</u>
 - \rightarrow Which transforms our <u>actions</u>

So What?

- Change happens from the inside out
- Are we letting God renew our minds? • Which leads to changed actions
- Are we letting Christ rule in us?
