Christ's on the Cross: Redemption

Luke 23:46

The Temple Curtain

- The curtain separated the inner courts from the <u>Holy</u> of <u>Holies</u>
 Holy of Holies represented the presence of God with His people
- It was 60' tall, 30' wide, and at least 4" thick
- It was made of woven thread
- It took 300 priests to move the curtains
- At the moment of Jesus' death it was torn in two from top to bottom (Matt. 27:51)
- It represented the Heavens & access to God
- The door had been opened into God's presence

"Father, into your hands I commit my spirit."

- Jesus' last words are of His trust in His Father (Psalm 31:5)
- He had finished what He was sent to do
 - OHe had redeemed us
 - To buy back, as in a <u>ransom</u> (Mark 10:45)

The Centurion's Confession

- "Surely this was a righteous man."
 - OA statement of Jesus' innocence
 - o Matthew & Mark: "Surely this man was a son of God!"
 - Probably literal
 - Luke translates its meaning for his audience
- The events that occur at the time of His death show that Jesus was no ordinary man

The Crowd

- Some <u>celebrated</u> Jesus' death (v. 48)
- But those who loved Him mourned (v. 49)
 - oIt was to this later group that Jesus later appeared

3 Days Later

- Jesus' resurrection is proof that He accomplished His mission
 - OHe redeemed us!
 - oIf He would have remained dead, it would mean that He could not buy us back from death

• Jesus' resurrection means that He can make good on all His promises

So What?

- God is in the business of Redemption
 - Turning garbage into gold
- Jesus' death was a catastrophe to those who loved Him
 - OBut, God has a way of turning the "bad" into something beautiful
- He wants to do that in our lives
 - OAnd it starts by trusting Jesus
