Signs of the Messiah: Raising the Dead

(John 11:1-45)

The Setting (v. 1-16)

- Jesus and his disciples have left Jerusalem for the region across the Jordan river known at Batanea because of attempts to arrest Him (10:40)
- During this time, Jesus' friend <u>Lazarus</u> becomes mortally ill
 OJesus had a close friendship with the entire family, including Lazarus' sisters <u>Mary & Martha</u> (v. 5; see Luke 10:38ff), though Lazarus is only mentioned in John
- When word reached Jesus of the illness, He declared that the sickness would not <u>end</u> in death • Pointing out that it will be used to <u>glorify</u> God through the <u>Son</u> • And then stays where He is for <u>2</u> more days
- When He tells the disciples that they are going to Bethany because of Lazarus, they are skeptical because of the threats to Jesus' <u>safety</u>
- He explains to them that Lazarus has <u>died</u>, and this was for their sake oThough they don't understand at first

The Resurrection & Life (v. 17-37)

- Four days after Lazarus' death, Jesus arrives in Bethany, and is met by Martha
- She shows her faith in Jesus' ability to heal, and even more than that (v. 22)
- Jesus tells her of His intent to <u>resurrect</u> Lazarus oThough she seems to think that He means on the <u>Last Day</u> when everyone will be raised
- He corrects her by stating that He is the source of <u>resurrection</u> and <u>life</u>, and asks if she believes Him
- Her response gives the clearest declaration of who Jesus is: The sent Son of God who has come as Messiah to give real life! (v. 27)
- Her sister Mary does not have the same hope, but is too caught up in her own grief
- Jesus shares in her <u>grief</u>, <u>weeping</u> at the death of His friend • While the crowd <u>questions</u> Jesus

The Sign (v. 38-45)

- Upon arriving at the tomb, Jesus calls for the stone blocking it to be moved • Martha, still not understanding, comments on the smell because Lazarus has been dead <u>4</u> days
- Jesus' timing in all this has been intentional • Rabbis taught the spirit of the deceased lingered for <u>3</u> days before resting until the resurrection
- Jesus prays aloud for the benefit of the crowd, so that they would believe that He is sent from God His Father
- Then, He called for Lazarus to come out

• Again, we do not see the <u>miracle</u>, just the consequence, as Lazarus comes out of the tomb still wrapped up in his <u>embalming</u> clothes

- This causes many to <u>believe</u> in Jesus (v. 45)
- But it also causes the Jewish leadership to finalize their plans to <u>kill</u> Him because these <u>signs</u> were so compelling (v. 46-53)

o And later they planned on killing Lazarus as well (John 12:10)

• All because Jesus showed Himself to be the source of <u>eternal</u> life that can raise the dead, not just on the Last Day, but now

So What?

- Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, who is came into the world to:
 - oUsher in the Messianic Age
 - OGive us access to God
 - oHeal our brokenness
 - oDeal with our sinfulness
 - o Provide our every need
 - 0 Give us true sight
 - Give us eternal life
- All the signs are there, do we trust Him to be everything He showed Himself to be?

Meditation Verse: John 11:25-26
