# **The Gospel of John**: The Feast of Tabernacles John 7:1-52

### God's Timing (v. 1-10)

- Jesus continued His ministry in Galilee for a while because of the <u>opposition</u> of the Jewish leadership o'They still wanted to <u>kill</u> Him because of healing the man on the Sabbath (5:18)
- When the Feast of Tabernacles was approaching, Jesus' brothers try to convince Him to go back to Jerusalem
  - o They did not believe in Him and likely did not appreciate the attention. He and they were getting
- He refuses to go on their timetable but travels later in secret

### A Good Teacher? (v. 11-24)

- The people have a variety of opinions about who Jesus is
- Once Jesus starts teaching in the Temple courts, the crowds are amazed at His <u>insights</u>, especially because He lacked <u>formal rabbinic</u> training
- Jesus informs them that He is pointing them to the truth of His <u>Father</u>, who sent Him oHe does not seek His own <u>glory</u>, but only His Father's oHe tells them not to judge by <u>appearances</u>

### A Question of Identity (v. 25-44)

- The crowd is divided over Jesus' identity
  - o Some think He is the Messiah because of the signs He performs and His teaching
  - OOthers question this because they think that He is from <u>Galilee</u> when Scripture points to the Messiah being from <u>Bethlehem</u>
    - Matthew & Luke inform us that Jesus was born in Bethlehem because of His <u>Davidic</u> lineage
- Jesus tells them that He is going away to a place that cannot follow o'This is a cryptic reference to His <u>death</u>, <u>resurrection</u>, & <u>ascension</u>
- He offers those who believe in Him <u>living water</u> (4:10), meaning the <u>Holy Spirit</u>

  o'The Feast of Tabernacles was a time of remembrance of God's <u>provision</u> for the Israelites during the 40 years in the <u>wilderness</u>
  - Jesus is utilizing the imagery of God's repeated miraculously provision of water in the desert

## Denial & Unbelief (v. 45-52)

- The Temple guards, whom the religious leaders had instructed to arrest Jesus, are likewise amazed
- Some of the Pharisees claim that both the guards & the crowds are <u>deceived</u> because none of their own have believed in Jesus
- But <u>Nicodemus</u> (3:1-21) speaks up in Jesus' defense, saying that they should hear from Him directly oHe alludes to the OT Law
  - o They show their ignorance of Scripture, saying no prophet comes from Galilee
    - <u>Isaiah</u> prophesied that there would be (Isa 9:1-2)

#### So What?

- What do we believe about Jesus?
  Is He just a good teacher, a prophet, or a miracle worker?
  Or is He the Messiah, the Son of God and King of the World?
- Is He alone where we place our hope?
