(Ephesians 6:10-18a)

The Battles We Face

- We daily face things that seek to <u>discourage</u> & even <u>destroy</u> us
- Some of these are <u>internal</u> • Such as our <u>sinful</u> <u>nature</u> or lack of <u>self-discipline</u>
- Others are from <u>external</u> sources oSuch as other <u>people</u> & <u>spiritual</u> forces
- In Ephesians, the apostle Paul encourages us to <u>stand firm</u> as we face these challenges (Eph. 6:10-18a)

The Battlefield

- Every battle we face is part of a larger war between good & evil
 - oGod vs. spiritual forces set against Him
 - The <u>Devil/Satan</u> being the <u>figurehead</u> of those forces
- Satan is a personal being
 - oAn angel who rebelled against God and works in opposition to God's purposes in the world (Dan. 10:13, 20–21; 2 Cor. 11:3; 1 Pet. 5:8; Rev. 20:1–3)
 - OBut he is not directly active in everything evil because he is not omnipresent
- He is used as a stand-in for all those powers that stand as God's adversary
 - \circ *Satanos* = <u>adversary</u>
 - oSatanic = in opposition to God's purposes

The Equipment to Wage War

- We *cannot* fight these battles on our own
- We need God's strength (Ps. 73:26; 28:7; 46:1; 59:9, 17; 68:35; 118:14; 140:7)
- We need God's armor
 - o Paul's imagery is drawn from the prophet <u>Isaiah</u>, who describes the Lord <u>armored</u> and ready to <u>defend</u> His people (Isa 59:17; 11:4–5; 49:2; 52:7)
 - This whole-armor is not simply spiritual in nature; it is God's own armor
 - Which requires God's <u>strength</u> to <u>wield</u> (1 Sam. 17:38-39)
 - It is composed of the <u>qualities</u> of God that He instills in His people as they rely on His <u>strength</u>
- Paul utilizes the protective garb of Roman soldiers as an analogy for these qualities
 - oBelt of Truth
 - OBreastplate of Righteousness
 - oGospel-Peace Shoes
 - OShield of Faith
 - oHelmet of Salvation
 - oSword of the Spirit
 - oPrayer!

The Battle Belongs to the Lord

- Christ Himself has gained ultimate victory over all hostile powers in the universe.
 - oThat means that Paul's instructions about the spiritual battle are not given as a means by which we gain that ultimate victory.
 - oRather, we must apply the result of Christ's victory in our own lives
