# The Big Picture: A Blessing to All Nations (Gen. 12, 17 & 22)

### God's Call to Abram (Gen. 12:1-3)

- Generations after the Flood & the Tower of Babel, God called <u>Abram</u> of Ur
   OHe had left Ur with his father years earlier, but they had settled in Haran, failing to go to Canaan (Gen. 11:31)
- Now, God called him and his wife Sarai to leave their family behind and travel to an <u>undisclosed</u> place
  - oIt is Abram's faith in trusting God that sets him apart (Gen 15:6)
- God's promises to Abram
  - OHe will become a great <u>nation</u>
  - oHe will be blessed
  - oHe will become a blessing to all people

### A Sign of the Covenant (17:4-8)

- God called Abram to show his commitment by taking a mark upon himself: <u>Circumcision</u> oA reminder that God is the source of his <u>offspring</u>
- With it comes a name change
  - OAbram: Great father
  - OAbraham: The <u>father</u> of many nations
    - This was all before <u>Isaac</u> was even born
- There is also a provision for <u>land</u> for his family to dwell in

## A Blessing for All (Gen. 22)

- God further clarifies His covenant promises when He tests Abraham by asking him to sacrifice Isaac
  - OAbraham trusted God to fulfill His promises, even if that involved resurrecting the dead (Heb 11:19)
- The story of Abraham fits into the metanarrative of Scripture as God brings clarity to how He will fulfill His promise to eradicate evil through a human agent
  - oIt will be through a <u>descendant</u> of Abraham that God will fulfill His promise and bring <u>blessings</u> to all people
    - oThat descendant is <u>JESUS!</u> (Matt 1:1)

#### So What?

- God's promise to Abraham was to bless the world
   Through Jesus He is doing that
- Do we know that blessing?
- Are we sharing that blessing?
