Ephesians: Tearing Down the Wall

Ephesians 2:11-22

Separation (v. 11-12)

- Paul first addresses his Gentile audience
- Before Jesus, they:
 - 0Had no relationship to Christ
 - oWeren't part of God' people
 - oWeren't part of God's covenant & promises
 - oWere without hope
 - oWere without God
- They/we were <u>separated</u> from God

Tearing Down (v. 13-18)

- But Jesus' sacrifice changed all that (v. 13)
- Jesus tears down separation
 - oThe Wall of Hostility: An actual wall in the <u>Temple</u> courts dividing the court of Israel from the court of the Gentiles
 - o"No *foreigner* is to enter within the partition wall and enclosure around the sanctuary. Whoever is caught will be responsible to himself for his death, which will ensue."
- He tears down the division between Jew & Gentile
 - oTo make something <u>new</u>
 - oThere is no difference anymore
 - oBoth come to God through Jesus
- He <u>reconciles</u> us to <u>Himself</u> and to <u>one another</u> oBringing us <u>peace</u>

Building Something New (v. 19-22)

- Jesus tears down the old so that a new Temple might be built up
- The <u>Church</u> is the new Temple • Not a <u>building</u> • But God's <u>people</u>, both Jew and Gentile
- We are the dwelling place of His <u>Spirit</u> (1 Cor 3:16)

So What?

- Jesus offers us peace with God & with one another
- So that we might be a community where Christ's Spirit dwells for the glory of God
- Do we know Jesus?
- Are we dwelling in that unity?
