The Gospel of John: Walking on Water

John 6:16-21

Splitting the Party (v. 16-18)

- Because of the response of the crowd:
 - O Jesus withdraws to a solitary hillside to pray (v. 15; Mt 14:23)
 - oThe disciples get in a boat to cross over the lake back to Capernaum
 - This was at Jesus' command (Mt 14:22)
- A windstorm starts making the sea rough

Treading on the Sea (v. 19-21)

- Once the boat was about 3 miles from land, Jesus catches up with them by <u>walking</u> on the <u>sea</u> o<u>Rough</u> seas, not a <u>calm</u> stroll
- The disciples, not realizing it is Jesus, are <u>terrified</u> • They think He is a <u>ghost</u> (*phantasm*) (Mt 14:26; Mk 6:49)
- Jesus <u>calms</u> them by declaring who He is o "It is I" = $Ego\ eimi = \underline{I}\ \underline{AM}$
 - This may have the undertone of <u>divine self-revelation</u>
 - Jesus is showing by His actions that He is God
- In Scripture, the Sea often stands for <u>chaos</u> & <u>disorder</u>
 oIt is God who <u>controls</u> & <u>stills</u> it (Gen 1:2; Job 9:8; 38:8-11, 16; Pss 29:3-4, 10-11; 65:5-7; 89:9; 107:23-32; Mk 4:41)
- Though they had been in the middle of the lake, they find themselves <u>safe</u> on the shores of Capernaum

So What?

- Jesus is the God of Creation, with control of it all
- Do we trust Him when the world around us seems in turmoil?
