The Gospel of John: The Good Shepherd

John 10:1-21

The Shepherd & The Thieves (v. 1-10)

- Jesus continues to address the Pharisees (9:40-41) by using the OT imagery of <u>shepherds</u> as <u>leaders</u> of God's people
 - oGod rebukes the leaders who <u>exploit</u> the sheep rather than guiding, nurturing & guarding them (Ezk 34:1-10; Isa 56:9-12; Jer 23:1-4; 25:32-38; Zec 11)
 - 0<u>God</u> Himself promises to be the people's shepherd (Ezk 34:11-16; Ps. 80:1; Is. 40:11; cf. Ps. 23:1)
- The true Shepherd has come in Jesus
 - oThose <u>under-shepherds/gatekeepers</u> who were tasked with guarding the sheep have failed to <u>recognize</u> Him
 - oBut those that His recognize His voice are His sheep
 - Middle Eastern shepherds walk before their sheep, and the sheep follow their voice
- Jesus also acts as a <u>gate</u> for the sheep, how they enter the <u>safety</u> of the sheep pen and are led out to <u>green pastures</u>
 - oTo be part of God's <u>people</u>, where we experience eternal <u>life</u> & divine <u>blessing</u>, we must come through <u>Jesus</u>
- The <u>religious leaders</u> who have acted in their own interests & <u>false messiahs</u> are <u>thieves</u> & <u>robbers</u> • They <u>steal</u>, <u>kill</u>, & <u>destroy</u>
- Jesus shows how He is the good shepherd by <u>laying down</u> His life for His sheep oHe <u>blesses</u>, gives <u>eternal life</u>, & <u>heals</u>

One Shepherd, One Flock (v. 11-16)

Jesus claims to be the one Shepherd who will:

Secure for our <u>salvation</u> & a <u>place</u> among God's people through His <u>death</u>
Unite both these sheep (<u>Jews</u>) with other sheep (<u>Gentiles</u>) to make one flock, just like God promised (Ezk 34:23-24; 37:24-25; Jer 3:15; Hos 3:5)
He is a shepherd-king like <u>David</u>

Laying Down His Life (v. 17-21)

- Jesus foreshadows His <u>death</u>, stating that He will <u>willingly</u> lay down His lie out of: • <u>Obedience</u> to His <u>Father</u>
 - 0<u>Love</u> for His <u>sheep</u>
- His audience is again divided over His claims:
 OSome think He is <u>demon-possessed</u> & <u>crazy</u>
 Others question this because of His <u>miraculous powers</u>
- Both responses reflect whether they are <u>blind/deaf</u> to Jesus oIf they were His sheep, they would <u>hear</u> His <u>voice</u> (Matt 13:14-15, cf. Isa 6:9-10)

The Shepherd-King

- On the night that Jesus was born, God sent angels to announce the good news to the shepherds near Bethlehem
 - oWho better to recognize the Good Shepherd than fellow shepherds
- Through Jesus, God fulfills His promise of a Shepherd-King (Mic 5:2-5a)

So What?

- Jesus is the Good Shepherd who lays down His life for His sheep
- Are we good sheep who listen to His voice?
- Do we, like the Bethlehem shepherds, tell others of our great Shepherd-King?
