## Christ's Word on the Cross: Forsaken

Mark 15:33-36

#### The Darkness

- From the 6<sup>th</sup> to the 9<sup>th</sup> hour
  About Noon to 3 pm
- Some see it as the Father turning His back on Jesus

#### Forsaken

- On the Cross, Jesus took on the sin of the world (1 Pet. 2:24)
- <u>Sin</u> cannot abide with God (Isa. 6:5)
  This is what keeps us from His <u>presence</u> (Rev. 21:27)
- Our sins were upon <u>Jesus</u>
  Odd turned His back on <u>our</u> sin

#### "But the Scriptures must be fulfilled."

- Jesus claimed that His arrest, crucifixion, and resurrection were necessary to fulfill God's revealed plan (Mark 14:49)
- Psalm 22
  - $\circ \ensuremath{\mathsf{We}}$  need to see the whole plan
  - $\circ \text{Mark's}$  Gospel follows the layout of Ps. 22
    - See handout online

# Elijah

- Perhaps a mishearing of "Eloi, Eloi"
- ○Aramaic for "My God, my God"
- Elijah was thought to be an <u>aide</u> to people in crisis
- The Jews were awaiting his return as a precursor to the coming of Messiah
- Jesus tells His disciples that John the Baptist fulfilled that role (see Matt. 11:12-14)

#### The Suffering Servant (Isa. 53:4-5)

  OHe died as the punishment we deserved
- Are we carrying around what Christ died for?
  Or are we laying our sin at His feet and leaving it there?
