The Lord is My Shepherd (Ps. 23:1)

A Song of Trust

- The Psalms are a collection of <u>songs/poems</u> used by <u>Israel</u> & the <u>Church</u> to <u>worship</u> the Lord oSometimes through <u>praise</u> & shouts of <u>joy</u> oSometimes through <u>anguish</u> & <u>tears</u>
- Psalm 23 acts as a song of trust in the Lord

Of David

- David was the author of this psalm
- He was the <u>second</u> king of Israel
 Called a man after God's own <u>heart</u> (1 Sam. 13:14)
 Had begun life as a <u>shepherd</u> (1 Sam. 17:34)

The LORD

- David uses the <u>covenant</u> name for God: The <u>LORD</u>
 <u>YHWH</u> = "I Am that I Am"
- This is the name that God told Moses is His name (Ex. 3:14)
- It is a name that invokes <u>relationship</u>
 oAnd sets the <u>theme</u> for the psalm as a whole
 oIt occurs again in the last verse to form an <u>inclusio</u>

My Shepherd

- Shepherds were well-known in ancient Israel as they were common in the land
- The image of shepherd was often used to describe <u>God</u> (Gen. 48:15; 49:24; Ps. 78:52; 80:1; Isa. 63:13; Mic. 7:14)
- It was invoked to describe the <u>leaders</u> of Israel, both positively & negatively (Jer. 3:15; 23:1)
- It was used to characterize the promised Messiah (Isa 40:11; Ezek. 34)
- Thus, <u>Jesus</u> is the <u>Good</u> Shepherd (John 10:1-16; Heb. 13:20; 1 Pet 2:25; 5:4)

I Shall Not Want

- Since the LORD is a good shepherd, He takes care of His sheep
 - oHe <u>provides</u> for them
 - 0He <u>leads</u> them
 - oHe <u>protects</u> them
 - oHe comforts them
 - OHe gives them life

So What?

- Are we trusting the LORD to be *our* shepherd?
- Are we being good sheep?
