ACTS: The Church in Antioch

Acts 11:19-30

Inclusive Evangelism (v. 19–21)

- Luke returns to the events of Acts 8 to show what God has been doing to spread the Gospel through others
 - oThe martyrdom of Stephen led to an outbreak of persecution
 - Which led to Jewish Christians fleeing Jerusalem and settling in <u>Phoenicia</u>, <u>Cyprus</u>, & <u>Cyrene</u>
- At first, these Jewish Christians only preached to other Jews
- But, eventually Jewish Christians from Cyprus & Cyrene began coming to Antioch and shared with <u>Gentiles</u> too
 - Which resulted in a large Gentile Church in Antioch

Barnabus in Antioch (v. 22-26)

- Like with Peter's account of Cornelius' conversion, the leaders of the Church in Jerusalem wanted to investigate the news of Gentile conversions in Antioch
- So, they sent <u>Barnabus</u>
- He found the Church to be vibrant and growing in their love of Jesus • So, he encouraged them to remain <u>purposeful</u> (v. 23)
 - And the Church continued to grow
- He then traveled to <u>Tarsus</u> to find <u>Saul/Paul</u>
 - About 385 miles away
 - oTogether, they spent a <u>year</u> training up the Church in Antioch
- This is the first place that the name '<u>Christians</u>' was used to describe followers of Jesus

 Christian = "Belonging to Christ"
 - Not a <u>self-designation</u>
 - The Church preferred terms like "believers, disciples, brothers"
 - This reflects a separate <u>identity</u> than simply a type of <u>Judaism</u>

Living It Out (v. 27-30)

- When God revealed through a prophet a coming <u>famine</u>
 - The mostly <u>Gentile</u> Church in Antioch looked for ways to support their <u>Jewish</u> Christian brothers and sisters in Judea
 - \circ They sent an <u>offering</u> to Jerusalem by the hands of Barnabus & Saul

So What?

- As the Church lived out the mission of Jesus:
 - oThey lived with purpose
 - Do we do the same?
 - $\circ \text{They}$ needed intentional training
 - Are we seeking to grow?
 - $\circ \ensuremath{\mathsf{They}}$ had a genuine concern for the needs of others
 - Do we?
