## Ephesians: Saved by Grace

Ephesians 2:1-10

### "Life" before Jesus (v. 1-3)

- Our lives before Christ are defined by <u>death</u> • Which comes from our <u>sinful disobedience</u> to God
- It is the "natural" state of the world
  - oSin has <u>distorted</u> our minds (see Rom. 1:21-22, 28)
    - "The flesh": We live as if God doesn't exist
  - 0 And thus follow the "prince of the power of the air"
    - In the ancient world, the atmosphere was the realm of spirits
    - This prince is the <u>devil</u>, the father of <u>lies</u>

# God's Grace (v. 4-7)

- *But God* acted on our behalf because of His: • Mercy: kindness towards the <u>miserable</u> and the <u>afflicted</u>, joined with a desire to <u>help</u> them • Love (agape): <u>Unconditional</u> benevolence
- If we are in Christ, we experience the benefits that Christ has earned
  - oWe are <u>made</u> <u>alive</u> with Jesus

oWe are *raised* up and *seated* in glory with Him

- Past tense used to show the certainty of present standing and future events
- "Already, but not yet" language
- And all this so that He might show us His <u>grace</u> o<u>Unmerited</u> favor

oThe heart of real <u>love</u>

## Salvation (v. 8-10)

- Through Christ, we have been saved:
  oFrom our <u>sins</u>
  oFrom the lie that we can have <u>life</u> apart from God
- Grace is the basis of our <u>salvation</u> • Which comes through faith in Christ
- Salvation is not based on our works
- Nor our own *ability* to <u>believe</u> in God (v. 8b-9)
  - 0 "This": <u>Faith</u>
    - Thus, our ability to believe God is even a gift from Him
    - So, we cannot boast even in our <u>faith</u>
- Salvation has a <u>purpose</u>
  - oSo that we will be God's workmanship
    - ποίημα (poiēma): God has created us for this purpose
- The purpose is to do good <u>works</u> • Which God already has <u>planned</u> for us

#### So What?

- Apart from God, we are all the walking dead
- We are not saved by the good we do, but we are saved to do good
