ACTS: Through Many Tribulations

Acts 14:19-28

Trouble Follows (v. 19-20)

- Those who sought to harm the Apostles in Antioch and Iconium track them down in Lystra
- And even after the crowd's initial response of amazement and confused worship of the Apostles, they are persuaded to <u>stone</u> Paul and leave him for <u>dead</u>
- However, he doesn't <u>die</u>!
 - \circ But rather goes back into the city
 - o And leaves the <u>next day</u> to preach in Derbe
 - <u>60</u> miles away = <u>2</u> to <u>3</u> days journey
 - oA testimony to God's power and Paul's determination

Strength through Tribulation (v. 21-23)

- The Apostles return to Lystra, Iconium & Antioch
 The very places from which those who sought to <u>kill</u> them had come
- To <u>strengthen</u> the newly formed churches

 Including teaching them that <u>trials</u> and <u>tribulations</u> are part of our <u>growth</u> as participants in <u>God's kingdom</u> (2 Tim. 3:10-12)
- To train up <u>elders</u> to <u>lead</u> these congregations
 Not professional <u>pastors</u>, but local leaders from amongst the congregations

The Return Trip (v. 24-28)

- After their second stay in Pisidian Antioch, Paul & Barnabus begin a trip back to Syrian Antioch
 - Stopping in Perga & Attalia on the way
- In Syrian Antioch, they report to the Church all the things that God had done to bring the Gospel to the Gentiles

So What?

Spiritual growth comes through hardship
 We should expect trials and persecution
