## **Acts: The Questioning**

Acts 4:1-22

### The Establishment's Fear (4:1-4)

- The religious leadership of the Temple that was present saw Peter & John's preaching & miracleworking as a <u>threat</u>
  - o Especially the Sadducees, the Jewish sect that was in power during this time period
    - The only accepted the books of Moses (Gen.-Duet.) as authentic
    - They denied the <u>resurrection</u> of the dead (see Matt. 22:23-33)
- They arrest Peter & John
- The first real opposition the Church has faced
  - Not from the people: The Church grew to 5000
  - But from the frightened Jewish <u>leadership</u>

#### Questioned & Answered (v. 5-12)

- The religious leadership gathers to make a formal inquiry of the healing
  - Annas and Caiaphas were both involved in the trials of Jesus
- They cannot deny that the man was healed, so they asked by what <u>authority/name</u> Peter & John have done it
- Peter responds by declaring that it is through the name/authority of <u>Jesus</u> that this miracle has taken place
- He also points out their culpability in <u>killing</u> Jesus
  - o And shows how their rejection of Jesus was foretold in Scripture
- This resurrected Jesus is the Cornerstone on which God's people is to be built
  - OThus, salvation is found in Him alone

## Warned & Released (v. 13-22)

- They religious leaders convene privately to discuss what they just heard
- The religious leaders see boldness in Peter & John
  - OWho are uneducated
  - Who are known associates of Jesus
- They do not consider the message's validity, but rather it's how to silence its spread
  - o So, they warn the Apostles not to <u>preach</u> and <u>heal</u> in the name of <u>Jesus</u> anymore
- Peter & John respond:
  - They fear God more than men
  - o They must <u>proclaim</u> Jesus!
- They are then threatened again and released
- The response of the crowds is <u>praise</u> to God for the healing
  - o Especially since the man had been crippled for over 40 years!

# So What?

- Even amid threats, the Apostles proclaimed Christ with boldness
- Are we willing to do the same?
