The Gospel of John: The Harvest

John 4:27-42

The Woman's Response (v. 27-30)

- Jesus' disciples return from town to find Him conversing with the Samaritan woman
- This was scandalous because she was:
 - oA Samaritan
 - oA woman
 - oA social outcast
- But they don't question Jesus' motives
- She returns to town to tell everyone about <u>Jesus</u>
 - OHis acceptance of her gave her the boldness to tell those who would have shunned her
 - She understood how 'good' the Good News is

Divine Food (v. 31-38)

- Once alone, the disciples offer Jesus some of the food they have purchased oHe uses this as a <u>teachable</u> moment
- He has 'food' which sustains Him: To do His Father's will
- Jesus echoes Moses' words in Deut 8:3 (see Mk 4:4; Lk 4:4)
- Jesus tells them that they have <u>work</u> aplenty to do as well by using an <u>agricultural</u> metaphor (Isa 55:10-11)
- He has just sown the <u>seed</u> and <u>watered</u> it in His conversation with the woman oShe is <u>spreading</u> that seed to those in town oThe <u>harvest</u> is coming to them: The <u>Samaritans</u>
- The hard work of <u>evangelism</u> is <u>God's</u> doing, not <u>ours</u> oWe get to be a link in the chain of all that God has been doing in someone's life

The Harvest Field (v. 39-42)

- Many Samaritans come out to the well to meet Jesus because of the woman's <u>testimony/witness</u> o And they put their <u>faith</u> in Him as the <u>Savior</u> of the <u>World</u> (3:16)
- He & His disciples stay with them for two days
 Crossing social boundaries to bring salvation to people that His disciples probably saw as 'others'

So What?

- Do we share the Gospel with the eagerness of the Samaritan woman?
- Are we willing to leave our comfort zone to do it?
- Do we trust God to bring in the harvest of faith in others?
