### Teach Us to Pray: Becoming a People of Prayer

Matthew 6:5-8

#### Prayer as Essential

- Too often in our lives, prayer is either absent, scarce, or our last resort
- Yet, prayer is <u>essential</u> to our relationship with God
- oIt is our direct communication with Him
- Despite our need for constant communication with the Lord, prayer can be difficult for us
- Jesus' first disciples also struggled with prayer
  - They fell asleep repeatedly when He asked them to watch and pray with Him during His hardest times (Matt 26:36ff)
  - oBut, they also asked Jesus to teach them to pray (Luke 11:1)
  - What followed is Jesus' teaching on prayer summarized in what we call the Lord's Prayer (Matt 6:9-15; Luke 11:2-4)
- Before Jesus teaches us how we should pray, He addresses the <u>attitudes</u> and <u>pitfalls</u> to avoid in prayer

# Who's Our Audience? (Matt 6:5-6)

- Jesus tells us to remember who our audience is
- He calls out those who pray publicly for the purpose of gaining the <u>attention</u> & <u>admiration</u> of other people

oSince those who do this want the praise of men, Jesus says they have already received their reward

• This is not a rebuke against public prayer or praying with others

Public prayer is <u>described</u> & <u>ascribed</u> throughout both the Old & New Testament
Especially in the <u>Psalms</u>

oAnd Jesus calls us to pray with one another (Matt 18:19)

• Instead, Jesus calls us to get alone and speak to God <u>privately</u> • This about staying <u>focused</u> on God

oThis NOT a rebuke of sharing our needs with others, since we are called to do that as well (Jas 5:16)

## Humility in Prayer (v. 7-8)

- Jesus also tells us that we are not impressing God with our lofty words and long prayers
- <u>Scripted</u> prayers can be used, like the <u>Psalms</u> • <u>But we don't need to impress</u> God to be heard • <u>Rather</u>, He knows our hearts and our needs before we even pray
- In fact, there are real dangers in using flowery language in prayer • In public, it can make people think that they are not able to pray because they can't <u>replicate</u> such forms
  - OIn private, it can lead us to think that we somehow <u>deserve</u> God's blessings by our performance
- Real prayer is a <u>cry</u> from our <u>heart</u> to our heavenly <u>Father</u>
  OWe speak to God with <u>respect</u>, but without <u>pretentions</u>
  OWe come <u>humbly</u>, but with <u>confidence</u> (Heb 4:16; cf. Eph 3:12)

#### So What?

• Do we come to God in prayer with humility and sincerity? Meditation Verse: Matthew 6:8
