## Centered in Christ: New Life in Practice

(Col. 3:18-4:1)

#### **Social Structures**

- Paul's focus here is show how our new identity in Christ is not meant to undo existing <u>social</u> <u>structures</u>
  - OBut rather to transform us in them
- That being said: Read your own mail!
  - oFocus on what God is calling you to do
  - oNot on what others should be doing

## New Life at Home (3:18-21)

- Wives are called to <u>submit</u> to their husbands
  - oSubmit (hypotassō): Suggests a <u>voluntary</u> willingness to recognize and put oneself under the <u>leadership</u> of another
  - It is to recognize a relationship of <u>order</u> established by God (v. 18b)
  - But it is <u>conditioned</u> by the husband's submission to God (see Eph. 5:22)
- Husbands are called to <u>love</u> their wives
  - oLike Christ loves His Church (see Eph. 5:23)
    - Sacrificially
  - o"Do not be harsh" = Do not make them bitter, resentful
  - oThis was counter-cultural
- Children are called to obey their parents
  - Obey: follow their instructions
    - Again, as long as it is not in contradiction with God's truth
  - oThis pleases God because it means we are living under His <u>rule</u> for our lives (see Eph. 6:1-3; Ex. 20:12)
- Fathers\* are called to be encouraging to their children
  - ONot give rules for rules' sake
  - 0Not <u>irritate</u> or <u>embitter</u>
  - OAgain, this was counter-cultural

# New Life at Work (3:22-4:1)

- Bondservant  $\neq$  <u>slaves</u> like in US history
  - oThey were employees for a fixed period of time
  - OWho were often well compensated
  - OAnd were rarely forced into labor
  - oThe modern equivalent would be employees
- Masters =  $\underline{\text{employers}}/\underline{\text{bosses}}$
- Employees are called to obey their bosses
  - ONot just when they are looking
  - oNot to just get ahead

- oBut, by way of service to God
  - The Lord is every Christian's true <u>Master</u>
- Bosses are called to treat their employees well
  - oNot exploiting them
  - oNot making things unnecessarily hard on them
  - Treating them like God treats you
    - Because you both have the same <u>Boss</u>

## What if they aren't Christians?

- What if my spouse, or my children, or my boss, or my employer is not a Christian oAm I required to still act this way?
- Yes, and even more so!
  - OBecause your behavior to them is a testimony to them of the God you serve
  - oYou are the Gospel they are reading!

### So What?

- Are you new in Jesus?
  OIs our life showing that to those around us?
- If we are new in Christ:
  - OHow we treat our family should reflect that
  - OHow we act at work should convey that
