The Son of David

Matthew 1:18-25

Matthew's List (v. 1-17)

- Matthew stresses Jesus' role as Messiah from the beginning of His Gospel (v. 1, 18)
- He focuses heavily on Joseph and his role in Jesus' birth
 - o The Gospel opens with his with a <u>genealogy</u> showing that he was a descendant of <u>David</u> (v. 1-17)
 - Under Jewish law, Jesus would be considered Joseph's <u>heir</u>

A Principled Man (v. 18-19)

- Mary & Joseph are engaged when she becomes pregnant
- But Joseph is not the father
 - o The Holy Spirit has caused her to become pregnant
 - o Though he does not immediately know this
- When Joseph finds out, he seeks a quiet divorce
 - OAt that time, engagement was a legal standing that required a divorce to dissolve
 - OHe wants to do so quietly because if others found out that Mary had been unfaithful, she would be shunned or even stoned to death
- Joseph's decisions show his character
 - OHe is a faithful, Torah-keeping Jew
 - o He is compassionate & merciful

Divine Intervention (v. 20-21)

- Before he can divorce Mary, an <u>angel</u> appears to Joseph in a dream oThe angel addresses him as "<u>son</u> of <u>David</u>"
- The angel explains the situation
 - OMary has not been unfaithful
 - OShe is pregnant via the Holy Spirit
 - oShe will have a son
 - OHis name will be <u>Jesus</u>
 - Ἰησοῦς/Jeshua: "The <u>Lord</u> is <u>salvation</u>"
 - He has come to <u>save</u> His people from their <u>sins</u>

The Foreshadow Fulfilled (v. 22-23)

- Matthew points to God's promise through Isaiah (7:14)
 - o The Davidic king Ahaz who was facing enemies and feared that he would be <u>killed</u> & his people destroyed
 - OA child was promised as a sign of God's presence & deliverance
- <u>Jesus</u> is the fullest expression of this promise
 - o A virgin-born Savior who will deliver God's people from their greatest enemy (sin)

A Faithful Father (v. 24-25)

- Joseph believes the angel
- He marries Mary, sharing in her perceived shame
- He doesn't <u>consummate</u> their marriage until after the baby is born, so no one can question the child's <u>parentage</u>
- He names the boy Jesus
 Naming a child was a father's responsibility
- God chose Joseph because:
 OHe had the right <u>family</u> tree
 OHe would be a good <u>example</u> to Jesus, reflecting the character of <u>God</u>

So What?

- Jesus is the Son of David, the promised Messiah who comes to save us from our sins
- Have we put our faith in Him?
- Do we, like Joseph, reflect the character of God to those around us?
