Names of God: YHWH Yireh

Genesis 22 & various texts

The Call (v. 1-8)

- God had promised Abraham that He would make him the "Father of many nations" • Even though both Abraham & his wife Sarah were too old to have children
- Then, <u>Isaac</u> was born to them when Abraham was 100 & Sarah was 90 • God made it clear that Isaac was how God would begin to fulfill His <u>promise</u> (Gen 21:12)
- When Isaac was a bit older, God called Abraham to do the unthinkable: To <u>sacrifice</u> Isaac to God • *Akedah*: "The binding"
- Abraham's response was <u>obedience</u> oHe gathered Isaac and the supplies needed and set out for Mount Moriah
- Isaac, unaware of what was about to happen, asked his father where the animal to sacrifice was oAbraham's response: "God himself will <u>provide</u> the lamb for the burnt offering, my son."

The LORD will Provide (v. 9-14)

- As Isaac is about to be sacrificed, God calls out to stop Abraham
- The Lord clarifies that this was a <u>test</u> of <u>faith</u>
 ODoes Abraham trust the LORD, or just want God's promised blessings?
 ONote: God later made clear that He does not want His people to sacrifice children (Deut 12:31; 18:10)
- Abraham finds a <u>ram</u> caught in a bush • God <u>provided</u> the sacrifice
- They call the place *YHWH Yireh:* "The <u>LORD</u> will <u>provide</u>" • Also transliterated: <u>Jireh</u>

YHWH Yireh in the NT

- Elements of this story point to something more than the faith of Abraham
 The repeated phrase "your son, your only son" (Gen 22:2, 12, 16)
 The statement: "God will provide for himself the lamb for a burnt offering" (22:8)
 The name itself: God *will* provide
- The author of Hebrews uses it as an illustration of Abraham's faith in God to keep His promises even by means of <u>resurrecting</u> the <u>dead</u> (Heb 11:17-19)
- John uses this same language to speak of <u>Jesus</u> (John 3:16; 1 John 4:9)
- Jesus is the <u>incarnation</u> of God's provision • He provides us <u>salvation</u> by being the <u>lamb</u> who was slain for our sins (Rev 5:6, 12; 13:8) • He provides us the means of having a right <u>relationship</u> with God the Father • He provides us His <u>Holy Spirit</u> to dwell in us

So What?

- YHWH Yireh means the Lord Provides • Through Jesus, He meets all our needs
- Do we trust Him?
- Are we content with what He gives us?
