Acts: Generosity & Fear

Acts 4:32-5:11

Generosity as a Declaration of the Gospel (4:32-27)

- The <u>boldness</u> that the Church had prayed for was shown in the continued proclamation of the <u>Gospel</u> (v. 33)
- And was lived out in their generosity toward one another
 - oTo the point that no one was in <u>need</u>
- One way this was expressed was through the selling of <u>property</u> and <u>possessions</u> and giving the money to the Apostles so that it could be given to those in need
- Thus we are introduced to <u>Barnabus</u> (Joseph)
 - OKnown for his encouragement
 - OLater a missionary with Saul/Paul
 - OHere, shown as an example of generosity

The Foils (5:1-11)

- Luke then gives an example of some who did not have a heart of generosity: <u>Ananias</u> & <u>Sapphira</u>
- They also sold property, but <u>lied</u> about giving the all proceeds to the Apostles to meet needs
 They held some back
- Peter, led by the Spirit, confronts first Ananias and then Sapphira about their deed
- The issue was not that they didn't give it all
- The issue was that they <u>lied</u> by saying they had
 - They lied to God and the Church to try to make themselves <u>look</u> <u>better</u>
 - An issue of <u>pride</u>
 - OGiving to the needs of others out of genuine love is an act of humility
 - An expression of our desire to be <u>used</u> by God
 - A declaration of God's <u>ownership</u> of all we have
- God struck them both <u>dead</u> as a <u>warning</u> to the Church
- A great fear struck the Church as a result of their deaths
 - OA reminder of God's holiness
 - OA reminder that God's people are to be known for their devotion to:
 - God
 - One another
 - The truth
