#### What is Kindness?

- Prätēs: Gentleness, meekness
  - OA <u>submissive</u> and <u>teachable</u> spirit toward God that manifests itself in genuine <u>humility</u> and consideration toward others
  - OStrength under control, power harnessed in loving service and respectful actions
- One who is gentle will not attempt to push others around or impose one's own will on others
- But gentleness can be coupled with <u>decisive action</u> and <u>firm convictions</u>

## The Gentleness of God

- God is gentle with His people (2 Sam 22:36, see Ps 18:35; Isa 40:11)
  - ONot imposing His will, but calling us to submit to Him in humility and love
- <u>Jesus</u> is the ultimate example of God's gentle nature (Matt 11:29; 2 Cor 10:1)

### Called to Gentleness

- We are called to reflect Jesus' gentleness to others
  - oln our <u>speech</u> (Pro 15:1, 4; 25:11)
  - oIn our actions (1 Tim 6:11b)
  - ○In humble service (Phil 2:3; Eph 4:1-2)
    - In fact, gentleness is a requirement for godly <u>leaders</u> (1 Tim 3:2-3; 2 Tim 2:24-26)
  - Even in how we <u>correct</u> others (Gal 6:1)
  - And how we witness to the world (1 Pet 3:15; Tts 3:1-2)

### So What?

- Are we letting the Holy Spirit produce gentleness in us?
- Are we known for our gentleness?
  - OMeekness, not weakness
