Acts 15:12-29

Getting Along (v. 12-21)

- After Paul & Barnabus recount God's work among the Gentiles, James* looks to <u>Scripture</u> to confirm what has been reported (see Amos 9:11-12)
 - oThis work of God among the Gentiles may be new, but it should not be a surprise
 - It was part of God's plan all along
 - Making one people for Himself out of all people of the Earth
- However, James asks the Gentiles for some <u>concessions</u> to get along with their new Jewish brothers and sisters
 - Refraining from eating:
 - Food sacrificed to idols
 - Meat that was strangled
 - Blood
 - Abstaining from <u>sexual</u> <u>immorality</u>
 - Probably a reference to Lev. 18:6–18
 - oThese were ritual aspects of the Law, not primarily moral
 - Moral purity was assumed of all Christians
 - ○The purpose of the Apostles' decree was to allow for real <u>fellowship</u> between the Jews & Gentiles

The Letter (v. 22-29)

- The Apostles & elders commission a <u>letter</u> to be sent to all the congregations that clarifies their teaching on salvation by <u>grace</u> alone
 - OAlong with the concessions to allow fellowship between the Jewish & Gentile believers

Freedom & Love

- Jesus offers us salvation based on grace alone, which gives us freedom
- However, we are to use this freedom to <a>serve one another
 - o Even submitting to one another for the purpose of greater fellowship
