The Royal Welcome

Matthew 21:1-11

The Donkey Riding King (v. 1-5)

- When Jesus sent His disciples before Him to get a donkey, He was showing the kind of king He was by <u>fulfilling</u> Scripture
 - oMatthew paraphrases Zech. 9:9
 - oThis image is set in contrast to the image of war in Zech. 9:10
- This king comes
 - oNot on chariot
 - oNot on battle-ready steed
 - ONot with bow in hand
 - OBut on <u>lowly</u>, <u>borrowed</u> donkey
 - o Meekly: Power under control to accomplish a purpose
- It is a symbol that Jesus came to bring <u>peace</u>!

The King the People Want (v. 6-11)

- When the people saw Jesus enter Jerusalem, they hailed Him as their <u>victorious</u> king oThey called Him the son of David: A reference to Messiah
 - oHosanna: "Save us!"
 - Even the children praised Him
- But less than a week later, they would be calling for His death
- They wanted to crown Him their king
 - OBut instead, they put a crown of thorns upon His brow
- They wanted a <u>hero</u> to set them free from the tyranny of <u>Rome</u> • But they needed a <u>Savior</u> to set them free from their own <u>sinfulness</u>

The Once & Future King

- With His first coming, Jesus came in meekness
 - OHis purpose was to bring about salvation and call the world to repentance
- With His second coming, He will come with a different purpose
 - OHis power will be unleashed
 - He will ride a <u>battle-ready</u> steed (Rev. 19:11)
 - OHis people will meet Him as their victorious king (1 Thess. 4:17)
 - oEvery knee will bow, and every tongue confess that Jesus is the <u>King</u> (Isa. 45:23; Rom. 14:11; Phil. 2:9-11)

So What?

- As we draw near the celebration of Jesus' victory over sin and death (Easter)
 - OAre we ready to see the King face to face?
 - OAre we preparing others to greet Him as well?
